LibrePlanet is the Free Software Foundation's annual two-day conference that brings together a diverse community of developers, policy experts, activists, students, and free software enthusiasts to strategize around legal, social, technical, and political issues; learn and share best practices; and celebrate and the free software movement. It is co-hosted by the Student Information Processing Board at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Over the past eight years, LibrePlanet has become one of the most prominent free software conferences in the world, and the one of the few technology conferences to run its infrastructure entirely on free software. Past keynote speakers including NSA whistleblower Edward Snowden, journalist and former executive director of the Wikimedia Foundation Sue Gardner, FSF founder and president Richard Stallman, and Open Source Intiative board of directors president Allison Randal. LibrePlanet is a well-regarded, visible event with hundreds of attendees, and thousands more watching the proceedings online.

The Free Software Foundation's staff supports LibrePlanet attendees with a Safe Space Policy, event incident response training, and a large group of friendly, trained volunteers.


